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# chevron in australia

From discovering oil off the coast of Western Australia, to leading the country's rise as a global liquefied natural gas (LNG) powerhouse, to pioneering carbon capture and storage technology, we've delivered Australian energy solutions for a growing and changing world for more than 70 years.

With the ingenuity and commitment of thousands of workers, Chevron Australia operates the Gorgon and Wheatstone LNG and domestic gas projects. We are a significant investor in exploration, and operate one of the largest carbon capture and storage systems in the world - all in Western Australia.

We also manage a one-sixth non-operating interest in the North West Shelf LNG and domestic gas project and have commenced decommissioning of Australia's largest onshore oilfield at Barrow Island.

# **gorgon project**

**The Gorgon Project is one of the world's largest LNG developments and the largest single resource project in Australia's history.**

Located on Barrow Island, a Class A nature reserve approximately 60 kilometres off the North West coast of Western Australia, Gorgon comprises a three-train, 15.6 million tonnes per annum LNG facility, a domestic gas plant with the capacity to supply 300 terajoules of gas per day to Western Australia, and produces up to 20,000 barrels per day of condensate.

Operated by Chevron Australia, the Gorgon Project is a joint venture of the Australian subsidiaries of Chevron (47.3 per cent), ExxonMobil (25 percent), Shell (25 percent), Osaka Gas (1.25 percent), MidOcean Energy (1 percent) and JERA (0.417 percent).



# carbon capture and storage

The Gorgon Project is home to one of the world's largest carbon capture and storage (CCS) systems dedicated to greenhouse gas abatement. CCS is a proven technology for reducing greenhouse gas emissions and involves taking naturally occurring carbon dioxide from industrial processes and permanently storing it in geological formations deep underground. The Gorgon CCS system commenced operation in August 2019 and continues to safely store greenhouse gas emissions in a giant sandstone formation two kilometres below Barrow Island.



More than 100 million tonnes (MT) of greenhouse gas emissions are expected to be mitigated over the life of the Gorgon CCS system.



Gorgon CCS system has safely stored more than 10.5MT of greenhouse gas emissions<sup>1</sup>.



Gorgon CCS is one of the world's largest carbon capture and storage systems of its kind.

# wheatstone project

**The Wheatstone Project is one of Australia's largest resource developments and the nation's first LNG hub.**

Located 12 kilometres west of Onslow on the Pilbara coast of Western Australia, Wheatstone comprises a two-train, 8.9 million tonnes per annum LNG facility, a domestic gas plant with the capacity to supply 230 terajoules of gas per day to Western Australia and produces up to 29,000 barrels per day of condensate.

The Wheatstone Project is a joint venture between Australian subsidiaries of Chevron (64.14 percent), Kuwait Foreign Petroleum Exploration Company (KUFPEC) (13.4 percent), Woodside Energy Group Ltd (13 percent), and Kyushu Electric Power Company (1.46 percent), together with PE Wheatstone Pty Ltd, part-owned by JERA (8 percent).

Chevron Australia Downstream, an Australian subsidiary of Chevron Corporation, delivers quality fuel lubricant products and services, including via its national network of Caltex service stations.

Caltex – a brand owned by Chevron globally – has been present in Australia for more than 70 years. Caltex customers receive a warm and friendly service and take advantage of the specially formulated fuel system-cleaning ingredient Techron®, available in all grades of fuel at the Caltex service stations.

Chevron Australia Downstream also owns and operates three product import terminals.

We deliver products and services to a range of industries including mining, resources, agriculture, transport, marine and aviation. We offer services such as bulk fuel supply, oils and lubricants, fuel equipment solutions, customised fleet fuel card solutions and expert advice on fuel management and health and safety.

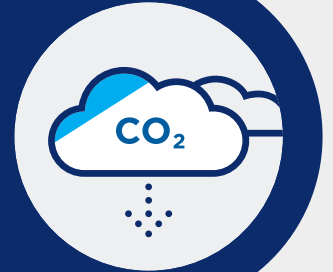




# advancing a lower carbon future

We believe the future of energy is lower carbon and that affordable, reliable, and lower carbon sources of energy are essential to achieving a more prosperous and sustainable world.

In Australia, we are taking action to advance global net zero ambitions with several investments and collaborations.



## australian CCS research

**\$40.45 million**

committed to CCS research projects in Western Australia, Victoria and South Australia, aimed at advancing knowledge of a technology critical to advancing a lower carbon future.

**\$22 million**

invested in the Barrow Dampier CCS Regional Study, led by global technology company SLB, which has delivered a three-dimensional seismic and storage assessment to identify new CCS opportunities in Western Australia.



**\$16 million**

invested in the development of new infrastructure at the Otway International Test Centre in Victoria. This project, led by Australian CCS research organisation, CO2CRC, enables testing of carbon dioxide migration and validation of new modelling techniques that could improve storage processes for future CCS projects.



**> \$2.45 million**

contributed to the Australian School of Petroleum and Energy Resources, located in Adelaide, to enable researchers to investigate how carbon dioxide is stored within geological formations after its injection into subsurface reservoirs.



## carbon sync .....

We are providing funding to Western Australian-based Carbon Sync to support a soil carbon sequestration pilot project involving up to 80,000 hectares of the state’s cropping and grazing region.

Our collaboration with Carbon Sync is expected to provide critical insights related to soil carbon projects, in a region with large potential for scale to help meet the forecasted demand for Australian Carbon Credit Units (ACCUs).

## raygen .....

We are providing funding from Chevron Corporation’s Future Energy Fund to enable Melbourne-based solar technology developer, RayGen Resources, to continue to develop its technology that merges solar power generation with long-duration energy storage.

## WA lower carbon grants program & greentech hub .....

As operator of the Gorgon Project, we are a founding contributor to the WA Government Lower Carbon Grants Program and GreenTech Hub, committing \$40 million to support the development and commercialisation of lower carbon energy technologies.

# health and wellbeing

## Chevron City to Surf for Activ

Chevron Australia has been proud to support Activ Foundation as the naming rights partner of the Chevron City to Surf for Activ since 2011, with all funds raised going to support thousands of people living with disability in Western Australia. Over the past ten years the event has raised more than \$15 million to help enable people with a disability to pursue a better life.

## Teach, Speak, Hear

Since 2011, more than 15,000 ear and hearing health screenings have been completed by the Chevron Pilbara Ear Health Program, delivered in partnership with Teach, Speak, Hear, also known as TSH. The program provides community liaison and education, mobile screening, diagnosis, and clinical care pathways including ENT surgery to address the significant ear and hearing health concerns of children in the Pilbara, with a focus on Aboriginal ear health.

Our partnership has significantly increased the scale of early diagnosis and intervention services in the region, driving greater health and education outcomes in the Pilbara.

## zero2hero

We are proud to partner with zero2hero in their mission to educate, engage and empower young heroes to become mental health leaders and help prevent suicide in Western Australia.

As Empowerment Partner, we support the delivery of three statewide school-based programs, with a focus on building resilience, compassion and mental health awareness among young people in our community.

## Zonta House Refuge Association

We support Zonta House Refuge Association, a specialist provider of family and domestic violence services, to deliver a range of critical recovery and prevention programs to support women and families who have experienced family and domestic violence in our community.

Our funding supports accommodation services, education to employment pathways and prevention workshops equipping participants with the understanding and tools to combat violence against women and work towards a safer and more equitable future for all.







## thriving communities

### Community Spirit Fund

The Chevron Community Spirit Fund offers grants of up to \$15,000 to not-for-profit organisations that contribute to improved health, education, environment and community outcomes across 10 locations in the northwest of Western Australia.

Since launching in 2007, the Community Spirit Fund has invested more than \$2.25 million towards 400 community projects, which continue to deliver positive change outliving the funding itself.

### Onslow education collaboration

The Onslow education collaboration is aimed to improve academic outcomes and support the physical, emotional and behavioural needs of all students who attend Onslow School.

The partnership allows the school to employ additional staff to support the students, and links Chevron's outreach partners who deliver incursions and provide additional support.

### Swans active education

The Chevron-operated Wheatstone project has partnered with the Swans Onslow since 2010 to improve social outcomes by improving health and wellbeing and enhancing community connections.

Our partnership supports Swans' staff to be based in Onslow to provide an early years program, after-school sports and an after-school club for children living in the Onslow community.

### Working Together for Onslow

In partnership with the Shire of Ashburton, Working Together for Onslow supports key community programs and events that includes Anzac Day commemorations, Onslow's seniors' group, school holiday activities and community development initiatives.

### One Tree childcare

Since 2021, the Chevron-operated Wheatstone Project has partnered with industry stakeholders to attract and retain childcare educators to the Onslow childcare centre operated by One Tree Community Services.



## Onslow Chamber of Commerce and Industry

Through the Wheatstone Project, Chevron supports the Onslow Chamber of Commerce and Industry as the Principal Partner, with their mission to drive local content and boost the social fabric and economy of Onslow.

Our partnership provides funding support for staff members to permanently reside in Onslow, allowing the Chamber to facilitate training and networking events, and advocate for their members.

## Karratha and Districts Chamber of Commerce and Industry

The Chevron-operated Gorgon Project supports a series of events and initiatives in Karratha and surrounds including the Grow Local – Business Capability program and provides funding for an Indigenous Engagement Officer to coordinate the Pilbara Indigenous Business Network Group programs.

## NAIDOC Perth

We are proud to partner with NAIDOC Perth to support the delivery of key cultural events that celebrate the rich history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. These events include the NAIDOC Perth Ball, the Miss and Mr NAIDOC Leadership and Empowerment Program and the NAIDOC Perth Awards.

We also support the employment of a Project Manager to ensure that these events continue to thrive.





## future skills

### Stars in school

Through the Gorgon Project, we support Stars Foundation to deliver a holistic program that empowers Indigenous girls to attend and remain engaged in school, complete year 12 and transition into future study or employment.

### Living STEM

We partner with the CSIRO to deliver the Living STEM program, aimed at supporting primary and secondary school teachers in the Pilbara to connect Indigenous knowledge to the classroom.

This program equips primary and secondary school teachers with resources and training to incorporate local Indigenous perspectives into their STEM curriculum. By doing so, it fosters a culturally inclusive learning environment that respects and celebrates the rich heritage of Indigenous communities and cultures. It also encourages students to appreciate the value of traditional knowledge in understanding and solving modern scientific challenges.

### Australian Earth Science Education

This long-standing partnership supports the delivery of improved STEM education with a focus on Earth and Space Science, including an outreach program in Perth, Onslow and Karratha.

### Scitech

Since 2007 we have partnered with Scitech to empower educators and inspire students to enjoy and engage with STEM. We support Scitech to provide unique STEM experiences through the Chevron Science Theatre, a dynamic event space that hosts science demonstrations and academic lectures.

We also support Scitech to deliver the Lighthouse Maths program, aimed at equipping teachers with best-practice techniques to boost maths outcomes in WA schools.





## energy and environment

### Conservation Volunteers Australia

We have partnered with Conservation Volunteers Australia since 2008 and, along with our colleagues at Caltex, we are proud to be the national partner for the Revive our Wetlands initiative and the Urban Shade project, supporting conservation and community engagement activities at 10 wetland and three urban shade forest locations across Australia.
